

THE MAN AS a PROBLEM of MODERN PSYCHOLOGY

The adaptive behaviour is not typical for the man.

The man is a non-adaptive creature. The feature of the man consists in his ability to build ideal spaces. The factor determining his behaviour, is not the external environment but ideal space.

In the ideal space the man constructs and reconstructs possibilities of the own behaviour.

The ability of constructing own possibilities allows the man to overcome any external and internal borders and to create himself and external environment.

The animal psychics is the adaptation in external limits. It carries out at the expense of borrowing possibilities of behaviour from external environment as images of reflection.

The human psychics is the way of overcoming of external limits. It carries out at the expense of constructing new possibilities of behaviour due to the reflexion of an own history.

The human psychics arises in the situations of a genetic problem. When the available possibilities cease conforming to changed external conditions.

Changed complexity of external conditions sets a required level of possibilities necessary for the successful realization of the adequate behaviour.

The way of solving of a genetic problem is the development as constructing of new possibilities of behaviour adequate to new conditions.
